GUEST MUSICIANS

RACHELL ELLEN WONG, BAROQUE VIOLIN

Violinist Rachell Ellen Wong is one of the most dynamic performers of her generation, celebrated for her commanding artistry across both Baroque and modern violin repertoire. In 2020, she made history as the first and only baroque artist to receive the Avery Fisher Career Grant. Her rare combination of gut-string virtuosity, expressive depth, and deep knowledge of historical performance has earned her international acclaim and a devoted following. Named the “most approachable virtuoso” by New York Classical Review, Rachell has performed as a soloist on five continents and collaborated with leading ensembles including the Seattle Symphony, Milwaukee Symphony, Academy of Ancient Music, Jupiter Ensemble, Bach Collegium Japan, and The English Concert.

DAVID BELKOVSKI, HARPICHORD

Born in Skopje, Macedonia, David Belkovski’s musical journey began with Balkan folk traditions and has evolved into a vibrant career as conductor, soloist, and continuist. Known for his vivid programming and compelling interpretations, David has directed ensembles including Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra, Juilliard415, New World Symphony, the Milwaukee Symphony, and Les Violons du Roy. Recent appearances at the Norfolk, Ryedale, and Aix-en-Provence festivals have highlighted the breadth of his artistry. This season, he joins the San Antonio Philharmonic to direct the complete Brandenburg Concertos and returns to conduct The Juilliard School’s fall opera, Mercadante’s *I due Figaro*.

ALEX GRIMES, BAROQUE VIOLA

Alexander Grimes is Principal Viola of the Pacific Northwest Ballet Orchestra. After graduating from Vanderbilt University, he attended New England Conservatory where he studied with acclaimed soloist Dmitri Murrath. Alexander is an active orchestral and chamber musician. Recent appearances have included the Seattle Chamber Music Society, Newport Classical, Arizona Early Music, Archipelago Collective, and Caroga Lake Music Festival. In addition to his career as an instrumentalist, Alexander is also a composer. He recently completed a Masters of Film Scoring at the Berklee School of Music.

JOHN LENTI, THEORBO AND BAROQUE GUITAR

John Lenti specializes in music of the seventeenth century and has made basso continuo improvisation on lute, theorbo, and baroque guitar the cornerstone of a career that encompasses baroque and modern orchestras, chamber music, recitals, and opera. He plays for the Metropolitan Opera, Seattle Symphony, Seattle Opera, and many other orchestras both modern and baroque. He studied lute with Nigel North, Jacob Heringman, and Elizabeth Kenny. His favorite authors are Jorge Luis Borges and Nancy Mitford, though Mona Awad and E. Lily Yu are knocking his socks off lately. When John’s not on the road he’s mostly a stay-at-home dad in Seattle. John likes cheap wine, fancy sausage, and mid-level cheese.

MEEKA QUAN-DILORENZO, BAROQUE CELLO

A member of the Seattle Symphony since 2009, multi-award-winning American cellist Meeka Quan-DiLorenzo, who thrills audiences with playing described as “incredibly nuanced” and “exquisitely beautiful,” made her professional debut at the age of 16 with the Pacific Symphony under the direction of Carl St. Clair, subsequently completing the Young Artist Program and Bachelor of Music degree at the Cleveland Institute of Music under the tutelage of Richard Aaron and Stephen Geber. At the age of 21, she joined the Utah Symphony as Associate Principal Cello, a position she now holds with the Seattle Symphony.
